Biographical Information

Albert Julius Norton was born on September 12, 1867, in Utica, New York. He earned his B.S. degree in architecture from Cornell University at the age of 17. Before coming to Denver in 1890, he worked with architectural firms in New York and Boston.

Norton spent a year in the Denver office of Varian and Sterner then joined Frank E. Edbrooke as a draftsman. In 1895 he left the firm and went into partnership with another Edbrooke employee, Willis A. Marean. The architects designed numerous residences, commercial buildings, and public facilities over the next four decades. Among their more notable structures are the Chamber of Commerce (National Register-listed) and YMCA buildings in Denver, Fort Morgan City Hall (National Register-listed), the Cheesman-Boettcher House (now the Governor's Mansion and a National Register property), the Greek Theater in Denver's Civic Center and the Cheesman Park Pavilion (both contributing resources in National Register districts). Other notable buildings no longer standing include Denver's Shirley Hotel, Shirley Hotel Annex, and the Plymouth Place hotel.

Norton traveled throughout Europe to study its art and architecture. He served on the Denver Art Commission from its beginning in 1904 until 1924. He also was a board member of the Denver Art Museum. Norton died in February 1944.
