The 1908 IOOF Hall/ Eureka Masonic Lodge #66 A.F. & A.M. was listed on the Colorado State Register of Historic Properties August 9, 2000 for its Social History and Architectural significance.

The town of Coal Creek was re-platted in 1910 by Rocky Mountain Fuel following a fire in 1907. The new plat did not match the original town plat completed in the 1800s. This change has caused significant problems for the town since that time because properties, even those owned by the town, have to be re-surveyed, lot lines vacated and re-platted. The lodge owners felt it necessary to make sure that everything pertaining to the lodge building was legal, so as to protect themselves, as well as their partnership with the State Historical Fund.

The Town and other property owners, such as Eureka #66, were not aware of this problem until recently. When the lodge owners applied to have the building put on the Colorado State Register of Historic Properties, the information provided was accurate as well as what was on record at the courthouse. This boundary amendment is just to bring the verbal boundary description in line with the legal description on file at the courthouse.
